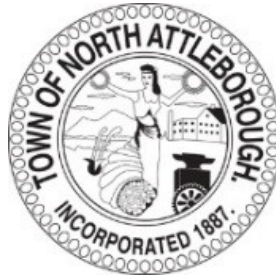

 - a. PUBLIC HEARING**
 - i. MASS General Law Chapter 90, Section 17C- 25- miles-per-hour speed limit in thickly settled or business district in City or Town

Residents that have requested 25 mph on their streets at the following addresses:

 - a. 89 Whalen Drive- 25 mph
 - b. South Washington Street - 25 mph
 - c. 53 Armstrong Drive - 25 mph
 - d. 171 Reservoir Street- 25 mph
 - b. Old Post Road- ANR
 - i. Speeding Issues-
NAPD set up Stationary Radar at various locations along Old Post Rd between 3/22 and 4/2. During those periods the average speed was found to be 35.5 mph. When a data collection sign becomes available, NAPD will install one on Old Post Rd. In the interim NAPD will continue an increased presence.
 - c. 171 Reservoir-ANR
 - i. Speeding Issues-
NAPD installed a Radar Board on Reservoir Street

- d. 100 Broad Street- ANR
 - i. Resident requesting a “No Parking” Sign in front of 100 Broad St. One of the officers went over to Broad St. The side including #100 is apparently signed for “No Parking”, but only at two locations and they are 100 to 200 feet apart. Additional signage should remedy this issue.
- e. 19 Church Street- ANR
 - i. Requesting a “No Parking” Sign in front of 19 Church St.
- f. Intersection of Route 152 & Raymond Hall Drive & Fire Station- ANR
 - i. Resident requesting a Blinking Light at the crosswalk

- a. Discussion of the process to be implemented for the Town’s Procedure of executing “The Town’s Acceptance of MA General Law Chapter 90, Section 17C” for certain streets in Town when requested by a resident. Changing the speed limit to 25 mph
