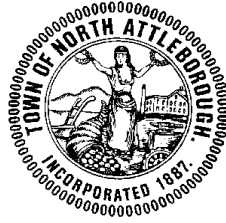

Below are key activities, which I felt would be of interest to you.

### COVID-19 Response

- **Effective June 15, 2021-** Lifting of the COVID-19 State of Emergency Order
- **Effective August 1, 2021-** Remaining industries will be permitted to open including health clubs, dance clubs and indoor water parks. All industry restrictions will be lifted at that time, and capacity will increase to 100% for all industries, with businesses encouraged to continue following best practices. The gathering limit will be rescinded.
- We are at a 0.77% Positivity Rate (Grey Community)- Only 6 cases last week!
- Changes with COVID for isolation, quarantine, and contact tracing have changed considerably with the case rates decreasing and the lifting by Governor Baker on restriction. HR will be working on incorporating the changes into an updated policy, but that takes time.

In the meantime, here is the most recent changes on contact exposures.

- **Indoors: no changes-** you are considered a contact if you were within 6 ft., for at least 15 minutes with someone who tested positive or had COVID symptoms (and subsequently found out they were positive).
- **Outdoors: you are not considered a contact any longer if you were within 6ft of a positive individual**
- **Emergency Management**
  - **Hurricane Season Preparation Emergency Management-** Hurricane Season began June 1, 2021. Chief Coleman has posted information to website and social media. As we begin FY2022, the Local Planning Emergency Committee will be looking at upgrading the EOC and other Emergency Management action items.
  - Cyber Security is always a main focus of the Town. Everyone needs to remain vigilant.
- **Communications – Updates**
  - **Memorial Day Observance- Saturday, May 29, 2021 at 10:00AM.**
    - The day turned out great, even though there was inclement weather.
